

Development Dimensions International and University of Phoenix FAQ

Can I receive college credit for my Development Dimensions International training?

Many training courses offered by Development Dimensions International have been evaluated by University of Phoenix and may qualify for college credit toward an associate's or bachelor's degree. Through Prior Learning Assessment (PLA), DDI learners may be eligible to receive up to 15 credits toward an associate's degree and up to 30 credits toward a bachelor's degree. The PLA process applies only to associate's or bachelor's degree candidates, and awarded credits are limited to elective or general education requirements. Does University of Phoenix accept transfer credits?

Yes, University of Phoenix accepts transfer credits from regionally and select nationally accredited institutions of higher learning. However, certain transfer credits may not be applicable to your degree program.

In addition to online courses, does University of Phoenix also offer campus-based courses?

Yes. We offer a wide variety of online and campus-based programs although program availability and format vary by location. Please check with a University Enrollment Advisor. Students can visit phoenix.edu/ddi to browse our degree programs and search online or local campus programs.

Is University of Phoenix accredited?

How long will it take to complete a degree?

Students can complete their undergraduate degree in approximately four years or less, depending on the number of previously earned and applicable credits. Students can generally earn their graduate degree within 18-24 months. Your Enrollment Advisor will be able to offer a more accurate evaluation of the time needed to complete a degree.

How often are courses offered? When do classes start?

University of Phoenix offers continuing enrollment, meaning that students can enroll year round and that many courses start every week. Contact University of Phoenix for specific dates available for new enrollments.

What kind of education and experience do faculty members have?
